*Author's affiliation, Times New Roman, 12 pt, italics, left aligned*

*e-mail of corresponding author, Times New Roman, 12 pt, italics, left aligned*

(keep 1 blank line between the e-mail address and main body)

The name of presenting author should be underlined, and the name of corresponding author should be marked by an asterisk. Multiple affiliations should be identified by attaching a superscript.

Text written in English, A4 format.

Left, right, top and bottom margins should be 2.0cm.

The area usable for each page is 170 mm \* 257 mm.

No page numbers, maximum 1 pages including main text, tables, figures and references.

Single line-spacing, full justification.

Times New Roman is preferable, 10.5 pt (main text) and 10 pt (references)

The reference(s) should be at the end of the extended abstract, and numbered in the order of their appearance in the text. Numerals for the references in the text are given in square brackets [ ]. In the reference list, periodicals [1], books [2], and multi-author books [3] should be cited in accordance with the examples shown below.

Reference to a journal publication:
